The Major Elective and Non-Major Elective courses allows students to explore subjects outside their major, helping them gain a broader understanding of different disciplines. These courses can provide a bridge between different academic fields, promoting interdisciplinary thinking and problem-solving abilities. The nonmajor elective curriculum is designed in such a way that encourages exploration and cross-disciplinary connections and provides opportunities for students to reflect on their interdisciplinary experiences. This approach can enrich student's education and prepare them for a rapidly changing, interconnected world. In postgraduate programs, interdisciplinary and Self-Study courses delve into interdisciplinary and multidisciplinary facets, enriching students understanding of these dimensions. Multidisciplinary and interdisciplinary research activities at national and global levels by networking with other institutes of higher learning, corporates and industry associations for conferences, workshops, seminars, certificate programmes has also created a viable quality culture., MoUs and such collaborations have also yielded study tours ,industrial visits, research collaborations, provision of short course and long transfer courses to support educational programmes and student learning.

16.Academic bank of credits (ABC):

Sree Ayyappa College for Women has always endorsed academic flexibility for students thus enabling their mobility across Higher Education Institutions which is the basic premise creating the Academic Bank of Credits (ABC). We had registered on Academic Bank of Credits via National Academic Repository. At a present number of registration on ABC under our, College is around 1300. The concept of multiple entry and exit will be made applicable

for the whole range of programmes in future.

17.Skill development:

Sree Ayyappa College for Women has instilled a creative and multidisciplinary curriculum in all programmes offered by the Institution. Each course has equal weightage of theoretical and practical inputs. The college offers industry related entrepreneurial courses for two credits to enhance practical exposure to academia - industry interface. The College also offers several Value Added Certificate Courses that have a specific focus on employability skills. These are in the form of Certificate Courses, with around 30-hours of contact classes, with a special emphasis on hands-on training. The Institution Innovation Council of Sree Ayyappa collge for Women fosters a vibrant innovation ecosystem, aiding HEI startups, preparing for Atal Ranking, and enhancing cognitive ability. IIC is Rated with 3.5/5-stars by the Ministry of Education, conducts time-bound innovation and entrepreneurship activities as per Central MIC guidelines. The Institutional Innovation Council of the college (IIC) offers various skill development programmes which included tailoring, fabric painting, Aari work, mushroom cultivation &workhops on robotics, medical coding , AI and Chatgpt etc were also conducted by the council. The College initiated the establishment of an Entrepreneurial and Innovation Institute(EDIITN) . It was inaugurated in Sepember 2022 to encourage student innovators/entrepreneurs from all over Tamil Nadu.. The Cell conducts orientation and induction programmes every year. It also conducts seminars/webinars in which successful entrepreneurs address the members of the Cell on issues related to entrepreneurship. They share their entrepreneurial journey and their inspiring success stories, while also giving practical insights into the challenges entrepreneurs face in the initial stages of business development. Naanmudhalvan upskilling courses given to UG students aims to provide training in their chosen field of interest that will help them to achieve their career goals. These courses provides free employment linked skill development trainings to the youth based on current industry gaps. Through this flagship programme, the students will be able to get trained and ensure that they will be placed in to companies based on their skill sets.

18.Appropriate integration of Indian Knowledge system (teaching in Indian Language, culture, using online course)

The college has a well-defined strategy to integrate the Indian Knowledge system into the curriculum with a special focus on

experience, observation, experimentation, and meticulous analysis. It has always promoted the use of Indian languages, culture, and value systems. As the institution adheres to the curriculum framework of Manonmaniam Sundaranar University, the Indian Knowledge system is integrated into the curriculum as mandatory credit courses such as Part I Languages for First and second year UG, and Part III Core XVI Regional Literature in Translation for Sixth semester BA English. As the college is a linguistic minority institution and the students come from both Tamil- speaking and Malayalam-speaking areas, it offers both Part I-Tamil(Course codes: C1TL11, C1TL21, C1TL31 & C1TL41), Part I-Hindi (Course codes: C1HD11, C1HD21, C1HD31 & C1HD41), and Part I -Malayalam (Course codes: C1MY11, C1MY21, C1MY31 & C1MY41) papers. The course Regional Literature in Translation (Course code: AMEN64) aims to acquaint students with the rich cultural and literary heritage of India. Part IV Yoga (Course code: CYOG31) in the Third semester is made compulsory for all Second-year students to provide them with an opportunity to learn about our indigenous knowledge system. The college has been offering an Undergraduate course in History in Tamil medium (ProgrammeCode:1308) since 1971. Bilingual mode of teaching is used, whenever necessary, inside the classrooms (except for BA English &; MA English) for the sake of understanding. This mode is followed in co-curricular activities as well. The college has always provided platforms for cultural celebration and intellectual dialogue, enriching the understanding of our Indian culture and heritage among the students. The college prepares the students to develop and exhibit their skills in their native languages. Fifty students from the institution participated in the "Maaperum Tamizhkanavu (Translation: A Great Tamil Dream) event held at Holycross College on March 9, 2023, which was a celebration of Tamil culture and intellectual exchange and Ms. Abirami, a first-year Botany student received the prestigious "Perumitha Selvi" award for her outstanding participation. With an objective of fostering a reading culture, knowledge-sharing, and enhancing the cultural fabric of the region, the college has sent seventy-five students to the Kanyakumari Book Fair 2023 (the Book Festival 2023) organized by Government Polytechnic College, Konam from April 14 to 24, 2023. Under the banner of the Fine Arts Club, the college organizes cultural competitions and programmes to inculcate an interest in Indian classical music, dance forms like Bharatanatyam, Thiruvathira, Folk dance, and art forms like Athappookkalam, Kolam (Rangoli) drawings, etc. annually. The Department of Tamil has conducted an intercollegiate Cultural competition "Kolussukalin Kondattam - Kala Srishti 2023" on 9th March 2023to foster the significance of the cultural art

forms among the young artists in Kanyakumari District and "Mupperum Vizha" as a part of Thiruvalluvar Day, International Mother Tongue Day and Muthamil celebrations on 21 st February 2023 to motivate them to understand the uniqueness of Tamil language and enrich their knowledge of the Tamil language and culture. Intercollegiate competitions were conducted on 22 September 2022 as a part of Bharathiyar Day celebrations to commemorate and promulgate the thoughts of Bharathiyar, one of the greatest Tamil literary and socialfigures of all times; and in association with the Vivekananda Kendra, 'Anna Pooja'was celebrated on 11 th October 2022 to encourage a social service mentality among the students. The Department of History organized a National Seminar on 'Unglorified Freedom Fighters of Kanyakumari District" sponsored by ICHR on 16 th September 2022. On 16 th February 2023, the History Department conducted a field visit to the Colachel area to provide the history students with the knowledge of the Colachel war and the Victory Pillar thereby instilling in them the historical significance of Colachel in the Indian freedom struggle. Moreover, the departments of Botany and Zoology also have organized field visits for the students to explore the indigenous flora and fauna of the districts of Kanyakumari and Tirunelveli. As a part of instigating a sense of pride and respect for Indian traditions, the institution celebrates festivals like Pongal and Onam. The departments of English and Languages organise literary and rhetoric competitions in English and Tamil respectively to promote the creative use of the languages and to develop thinking among the students. The institution publishes a yearly Magazine "Reflections" wherein the content is divided into four linguistic categories- Tamil, Hindi, Malayalam, and English. It encourages the students to express their literary talents in their comfortable language. Students are also encouraged to participate and represent the college in events that enhance the integration of Indian Knowledge systems organised by other colleges and institutions. In order to celebrate Hindi Diwas, NSS Units in association with Department of Hindi and Nehru YuvaKendra, Kanyakumari organized intercollegiate elocution and essay writing, to promote the language and to encourage students to participate in the celebrations on September 14,2022. Opportunities such as these not only impart knowledge about indigenous practices but also foster in students a sense of communal harmony. The students who reside in the college hostels also conduct several programmes like Hostel day to emphasise the need to create a secular environment. Celebrations during Onam, Saraswathypooja, Diwali and Pongal are examples of student initiatives to foster cultural inclusivity.

19. Focus on Outcome based education (OBE): Focus on Outcome based education (OBE):

Sree Ayyappa college for Women offers a range of programmes and course options that are aligned with local, national, regional and global developmental needs and trends. The curriculum developed and implemented from 2021 onwards prescribed by Manonmaniam Sundaranar University integrates Outcome Based Education into the existing five part curriculum in the CBCS format. Institutional Learning Outcomes (ILOs), Programme Learning Outcomes (PLOs), Programme Specific Learning Outcomes (PSLOs) and Course Learning Outcomes (CLOs) are aligned with national and global mandates of high quality education, life-long learning, development of critical thinking and problem solving skills, effective communication, and the ability to work in communities. Core and Major Elective courses contribute to the development of disciplinary knowledge, it relates technical and analytical skills and employability of the students. It also focuses on identifying cutting-edge tools in the disciplines in addition to equipping them to pursue academic / professional/ industrial careers that would contribute meaningfully towards nation building. Keeping in view the need for an interdisciplinary approach in education, the college offers interdisciplinary courses in the curriculum and are intended to encourage students to engage in research output, collaboration, and networking at different levels in academia. General elective courses offered gives students an opportunity for holistic development and encourages exploration of various fields outside their major field of study. Life skills courses, an important part of our vision of education, equip students with basic computer skills, personal and social skills. They also create awareness in areas such as responsible citizenship, some important legal rights, food and energy balance and energy conservation. Environmental Studies and related core courses ensure that students adopt sustainable alternatives, appreciate the importance of biodiversity and a balanced ecosystem. The value education courses enable students to reflect upon values in personal life and help them build self-awareness with an emphasis on the emotional and spiritual quotient. These courses also help the students to appreciate cultural diversity of the nation, to understand the role of youth in nation building, to handle value conflicts and to contribute to peace initiatives towards building harmony.

20.Distance education/online education:

Sree Ayyappa College for Women encourages independent learning through online courses such as SWAYAM and NPTEL. The College has

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established a Local Chapter for NPTEL (National Programme on Technology Enhanced Learning) in 2019 to assist students, scholars, teachers and lifelong learners in their studies. These initiatives cover educational requirements of learners ranging from school to Post Graduate.and research. Faculty members had enrolled to the courses and received certificates and recognition depending on the performance of the students mentored. The faculty and the students also had obtained ELITE certificate for their top performances in their examinations.. The College plans to offer more online courses and use online learning platforms such as MOOCS optimally in order to create future-ready graduates Our SWAYAM -NPTEL local chapter 2941 was recognized as an active local chapter from NPTEL for Jan-April 2023 Semester examination.

2.5 - Evaluation Process and Reforms

2.5.1 - Mechanism of internal assessment is transparent and robust in terms of frequency and mode. Write description within 200 words.

Our institution is, affiliated to the Manomaniam Sundaranar University and has a robust and transparent mechanism in conducting the internal and external examination. The ways and means to address the problems related to the marks and rectification are imparted to the students during the Orientation programmes. Continuous Internal Evaluation (CIE) incorporates test papers, seminars and assignments as part of formative evaluation of students. Internal exams, prepared in accordance with Outcome Based Education, are conducted before each University exam. Portions for the internal exams as well as the exam dates are notified to the students in advance to give ample time for preparation. The examinations and assignments are objectively

analyzed and their marks are recorded in registers. After each written internal assessment, the papers marked by the faculty are returned to the students promptly so that they can analyze if there is any error, which is then rectified. It is strictly ensured that all Internal mark lists are rigorously checked by the faculty in charge, the student, the HoD and the Principal and only then forwarded to the University. CCTV cameras in the exam halls ensure the fair conduct of students during exams.

2.5.2 - Mechanism to deal with internal examination related grievances is transparent, time-bound and efficient

Examination Cell addresses various grievances of the students with reference to the Internal Examinations. Instructions are provided to the students well in advance regarding the redressal of grievances by the Examination Cell through the department heads by the class in charges. With reference to the internal examination process, the students report to the department teachers for clarification of Internal Assessment related issues. The IQAC ensures proper evaluation system by scheduling a regular academic audit system which audits the question paper with bloom's taxonomy. It also ensures the distribution of learning materials amongst the students. In addition, the remedial class attendance is monitored to understand and observe the efforts taken towards the academic improvement of the slow learners. The schedule of the examination and the seating arrangements are displayed at the respective notice boards well in advance to avoid chaos on the day of the assessment. The evaluation of the answer scripts is audited with reference to the answer keys and the marks are sent to the parents of the students two days after the completion of every assessment test. Hence the grievance redressal system is made transparent, time-bound and efficient.

2.5 - Evaluation Process and Reforms

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2.5.1 - Mechanism of internal assessment is transparent and robust in terms of frequency and mode. Write description within 200 words.

Our institution is, affiliated to the Manomaniam Sundaranar University and has a robust and transparent mechanism in conducting the internal and external examination. The ways and means to address the problems related to the marks and rectification are imparted to the students during the Orientation programmes. Continuous Internal Evaluation (CIE) incorporates test papers, seminars and assignments as part of formative evaluation of students. Internal exams, prepared in accordance with Outcome Based Education, are conducted before each University exam. Portions for the internal exams as well as the exam dates are notified to the students in advance to give ample time for preparation. The examinations and assignments are objectively analyzed and their marks are recorded in registers. After each written internal assessment, the papers marked by the faculty are returned to the students promptly so that they can analyze if there is any error, which is then rectified. It is strictly ensured that all Internal mark lists are rigorously checked by the faculty in charge, the student, the HoD and the Principal and only then forwarded to the University. CCTV cameras in the exam halls ensure the fair conduct of students during exams.

2.5.2 - Mechanism to deal with internal examination related grievances is transparent, timebound and efficient

Examination Cell addresses various grievances of the students with reference to the Internal Examinations. Instructions are provided to the students well in advance regarding the redressal of grievances by the Examination Cell through the department heads by the class in charges. With reference to the internal examination process, the students report to the department teachers for clarification of Internal Assessment related issues. The IQAC ensures proper evaluation system by scheduling a regular academic audit system which audits the question paper with bloom's taxonomy. It also ensures the distribution of learning materials amongst the students. In addition, the remedial class attendance is monitored to

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understand and observe the efforts taken towards the academic improvement of the slow learners. The schedule of the examination and the seating arrangements are displayed at the respective notice boards well in advance to avoid chaos on the day of the assessment. The evaluation of the answer scripts is audited with reference to the answer keys and the marks are sent to the parents of the students two days after the completion of every assessment test. 4.1 - Physical Facilities

4.1.1 - The Institution has adequate infrastructure and physical facilities for teaching-learning. viz., classrooms, laboratories, computing equipment etc.

The institution provides all infrastructural facilities to meet the requirement of curricular, co-curricular and extracurricular activities as per the Government/ UGC norms.

The institution has adequate facilities for sports and games activities. The Physical Education Directress takes up many initiatives to promote sports and health related activities and encourages students to actively participate iin indoor and outdoor sports activities. The college has a spacious play ground with facilities for kho-kho, kabaddi, badminton, basket ball and athletics. Students are encouraged to play indoor games like caroms, table tennis and chess and are motivated to take part in intercollegiate, zonal and district level competitions. Facilities have been arranged for handling safe and environment friendly disposal of sanitary napkins, which comes under the bio-medical waste category. Bio degradable solid waste are collected daily and dumped alternatively in pits excavated in a corner inside the hostel campus area and allowed to decompose. At a later date this is used as biogas for cooking purpose in the hostel. The College has an E Waste Policy in place for the safe handling and disposal of E-waste generated within the Campus. E-waste generated is given to the authorized dealers who purchase the scrap and reuse the useful components. .. In the organic farming initiative, bio-manures involving kitchen waste from both Hostel as well as Canteen is used successfully for increasing the plant yield. Inorganic wastes like concentrated acid or alkaline materials are neutralized before disposal.
