



3.Quiz on 'Drug Awareness'






Out come


A consolation prize was awarded to Karishma P. V and Abitha R from the I B.Com Self team for their commendable effort and participation.




Out come

highlighted their dedication to the cause. The rally aimed to spread awareness about the harmful effects of drug abuse and to encourage students to advocate against drug use.



Impact and Outcomes



Conclusion





Feedback and Impact


The feedback received was overwhelmingly positive, with attendees noting:

This event serves as a valuable model for future initiatives aimed at empowering youth and fostering a drug-free environment in Kanniyakumari District.






















Report on the 39th National Eye Donation Fortnight Walkathon-2024
