




2. Name of the activity: International Yoga Day Celebration






5. Name of the activity: Distribution of notebooks to economically disadvantaged students

Date: September 10, 2024

Report: NSS volunteers cleaned the water body at Suchindram, Kanyakumari organised by Exnora International and National Green Corps, Kanyakumari on 10 September 2024. It was inaugurated by Honourable District Collector Mrs Azhagu Meena IAS. Participation certificates were distributed by respected Shri Vijay Vasanth MP and Shri M R Gandhi MLA to the NSS volunteers of NSS Unit No 97. The Ramsar site near Suchindrum is an important wetland area recognized for its biodiversity and ecological value. Pond cleaning efforts are crucial for maintaining water quality and supporting local wildlife. The primary goal of the

pond cleaning was to remove debris, invasive species, and pollutants to enhance habitat quality for aquatic life and improve overall ecosystem health. 50 Volunteers and local environmental groups participated in the cleaning process, which involved the removal of litter, vegetation management, and sediment removal.Waste materials were sorted and disposed of responsibly, and some organic material was composted.Cleaning efforts have led to increased visibility of native plant species and improved conditions for fish and bird populations.







8. Name of the activity: Swachhata Hi Seva 2024 campaign

Report: The Swachhata Hi Seva 2024 campaign, aimed at promoting cleanliness and hygiene, saw an enthusiastic participation from NSS (National Service Scheme) volunteers of Unit No 97 held on September 23,2024. This initiative included a pond (Alayankulam) cleaning, awareness rally, tree plantation and a human chain for oath-taking to emphasize the importance of cleanliness and environmental conservation in association with Thalakulam Grama Panchayat .Participants were equipped with gloves, bags, and cleaning tools. The goal was to clean the pond area, removing plastic waste and other pollutants. The volunteers worked collaboratively, demonstrating effective teamwork. Following the cleaning activity, an oath-taking ceremony took place. Volunteers and participants pledged to uphold the values of cleanliness and environmental responsibility. The oath included commitments to promote cleanliness in their communities and to actively participate in future cleanliness drives.
